The planned tour of northwestern Colorado sites, scheduled for September 18-20, has been cancelled. The organizer, Cal Jennings, has been swamped with last minute project work.

Tax Exempt Status and Dues Deductions

Judi Halasi's <u>ad hoc</u> committee researching the matter of how much lobbying CCPA can engage in without jeopardizing our tax exempt status has found that we can pursue direct contacts with legislators and other officials in so far as we do not engage in "grass roots" lobbying. That is, if all of our correspondence is directed to elected or other officials, and if we in no way attempt to include members of the general public in our efforts, we are free to carry on as much lobbying as we can support. Also, our dues remain fully tax deductible.

The committee has made suggestions concerning the establishment of a fund, or funds, to meet various special purposes which might fall into the realm of non-grassroots lobbying. This suggestion has been taken under advisement by the Executive Committee.

The New Newsletter Editorship

The editorial and production responsibilities for the CCPA Newsletter have been shifted from the Colorado Preservation Office to Colorado State University. Cal Jennings is editor with Liz Morris, Joyce Herold, and Earl Ingmanson acting as Editorial Board. We will be making some changes from the previous format. Some of the changes currently under discussion are:

- 1) Using a two column page (as used here).
- Inclusion of a column written by the CCPA President in each issue.
- Adopting a regular quarterly publication schedule.
- Having a regularly appearing COPA column.
- 5) Publishing selected letters from the readers.
- 6) Recruiting regional correspondents to provide information from various parts of the state which may be of either local or state-wide interest.

 Printing one or two major articles dealing with work or issues of interest to the professional archaeological community in Colorado or neighboring states.
